FOREWORD

The California Public Resources Code directs the State Board of Forestry and Fire Protection to designate state and privately-owned forest, watershed and rangeland as "State Responsibility Area (SRA)." The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's (CDF) mission is to protect natural resources on those lands from damage by wildfire. Land not designated as SRA, is the protection responsibility of federal or local agencies.

CDF provides wildland fire protection for most State Responsibility Area. The remainder is protected by different agencies and counties under contract with the state. CDF also contracts to provide wildland fire protection on certain federal lands, and provides contracted life and property protection for numerous local governments. This protection of other agency land becomes the "Direct Protection Responsibility" (DPA) of CDF.

This annual report is primarily a statistical record of fires and damage on CDF's DPA. The statistical information provided in this report is gathered from CDF's Emergency Activity Reporting System (EARS) and California All Incident Reporting System (CAIRS), which was implemented in CDF between August and November 2006. The Emergency Activity Reporting System (EARS) captures fire related incidents for CDF's 650 fire stations statewide. These stations report 37,000 fire emergencies, but respond to approximately 350,000 fire and other emergencies each year. EARS captured data on fire-related incidents only. CAIRS will collect data on wildland fires, structure fires and other incidents, such as medical emergencies, automobile accidents, lost hikers, hazardous material spills, train wrecks, floods, and earthquakes. This new system will give CDF the ability to track its full workload. California All Incident Reporting System (CAIRS) is a web-based subscription service, which is compliant with the United States Fire Administration's (USFA) National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS).

Although CAIRS data elements are different than EARS, CDF has been able to program reports to continually collect the majority of historical information collected in this report.

GLOSSARY

CDF

California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection

CONTRACT COUNTY

Counties that protect State Responsibility Area with their fire departments. For providing that protection the counties receive payment from the state, and CDF support and reinforcement as needed for fire suppression. There are six contract counties: Kern, Los Angeles, Marin, Orange, Santa Barbara, and Ventura.

DIRECT PROTECTION

The area protected by an agency with its own fire protection force.

FEDERAL DPA

The direct protection area of U.S. Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, Department of Defense, and Bureau of Indian Affairs. State Responsibility Area within federal DPA is protected by federal agencies.

LOCAL DPA

Area in which there is no State Responsibility Area. In general, this is valley floor and desert land. Fire protection in local DPA is provided by local government agencies; such as, cities, counties, and fire districts, or by the CDF under contract to local governments.

LOCAL DPA FIRE

A fire that is the responsibility of the local government.

STATE RESPONSIBILITY AREA (SRA)

The area designated by the State Board of Forestry on which the state assumes financial responsibility for protecting natural resources from damage by fire.

STATE RESPONSIBILITY WILDFIRE

A fire in SRA which burns or threatens to burn natural resources.

STATE DPA

State Responsibility Area and intermingled federal lands protected by the CDF.

WILDFIRE


Contraction of "wildland fire." This term is used by wildland fire protection agencies to indicate a vegetation fire. Wildfire generally replaces such terms as forest fire, brush fire, range fire, and grass fire.





2006 FIRE SUMMARY

CDF's firefighters, fire engines and aircraft respond to an average of 5,674 wildland fires and answer nearly 350,000 calls for other emergencies each year. During 2006 CDF responded to 4,805 wildfires within its Direct Protection Area. This represents a decrease of 2% below last year and 19% below the 5-year average. These fires burned 222,896 acres which is 60% above last year and 24% above the 5-year average.

The opening of fire season varies geographically throughout the state based upon weather conditions, fuel loads and increased fire activity. This year the Southern Region, Amador-El Dorado Unit and Nevada-Yuba Placer Units all opened fire season on June 5th. The rest of the units followed on June 12th. During the month of July, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger declared a state of emergency for San Bernardino County as a result of wildfires. The Sawtooth was the most damaging fire of the year burning 62,000 acres and destroying 273 structures and damaging 14 more. Fire season was fully involved throughout the state from June through December causing dozens of wildfires. These out of control fires are common in California during the summer and fall months due to a combination of strong winds, high temperatures and dry vegetation. The last units to close fire season were Riverside, San Bernardino and San Diego on December 18th.

It is CDF's goal to keep 95% of the fires contained to 10 acres or less which was not accomplished this year with 93%. This percentage reflects the 4,482 wildfires which burned 10 acres or less out of the total 4,805 wildfires.

GENERAL FIRE CAUSE DEFINITIONS

UNDETERMINED – After investigation the cause of the fire is not known.

LIGHTNING – Fire started by lightning.

CAMPFIRE – Fire started from a campfire. A “campfire” is a fire used for cooking, warmth, lighting, ceremonial, or aesthetic purposes, not within a building, mobile home, or living accommodation mounted on a motor vehicle.” (4103.5 PRC) In addition to the traditional type of open campfires, this category includes lanterns, and cooking and warming stoves used in camping or ceremonial activity, etc. when outside a building, mobile home, or living accommodation mounted on a motor vehicle.

SMOKING – Fire started from smoking tobacco or other material; includes matches and other heat sources used in smoking.

DEBRIS BURNING – Fire started by burning refuse, slash, trash, rights-of-way, or rangeland.

Dooryard – Fire started by burning a trash pile, incinerator, etc., usually with a dooryard-burning permit, Form LE-62.

Other – Fire started by project, contract, slash or other burning, usually with a Project Permit Form LE-7, or application and burning permit, Form LE-5.

ARSON – Fire started willfully and maliciously to burn or attempt to burn structures, forest land, or property.

EQUIPMENT USE – Fire started by the use of mechanical or electrical equipment.

Stationary Equipment – Fire started by any mechanical equipment that is stationary (not normally portable).

Portable Equipment – Fire started by any mechanical equipment or tool that is portable (not normally stationary).

Other Equipment – Fire started by any equipment not listed above.

VEHICLE – Fire started by a motorized transportation vehicle.

RAILROAD – Fire started by railroad rolling stock, such as speeder, locomotive, or rail car.

ELECTRICAL POWER – Fire started by electric distribution or transmission, powerline – hardware, pole or tower, and conductors, to the user’s meter.

PLAYING WITH FIRE – Fire started without malicious intent by adults or children playing or experimenting with fire or fire-causing agents. Includes fires started unintentionally while playing with fireworks, toys, models and other fire-causing devices. When children cause a fire by smoking, the intent determines the cause, i.e., if smoking as a play activity, use “Playing with fire”; if smoking as a smoker, the cause is “Smoking.”

OTHER CAUSE OR OTHER/MISCELLANEOUS – Fire started by events or activities that cannot be logically placed in any of the preceding “cause” classifications. Examples are electrical wiring on user’s side of meter, explosives and munitions (without arson intent) fireworks or signal devices (not in play activity), spontaneous combustion, spark from fireplace (when not debris burning), horseshoe spark, light bulb, or natural source (not lightning). Do not use for fires of unknown cause unless “other” is the most logical choice of causes.





NUMBER OF FIRES BY CLASS SIZE STATEWIDE - 2006









Dollar Damage by Cause, by Unit, County


Dollar Damage by Size Class, By Unit, County


PERCENT OF FIRES BY CAUSE STATEWIDE 2006












CDF DIRECT PROTECTION AREA WILDFIRES BY CAUSE








CDF DIRECT PROTECTION AREA ACRES BURNED BY AREA





NUMBER OF FIRES BY MONTH 2006




ACRES BURNED BY MONTH 2006








NUMBER OF INCIDENTS BY TIME (HOURS)



STRUCTURES DESTROYED CDF DIRECT PROTECTION 1997 - 2006




