Comments:

The CDF building collection contains only two USFS-CCC "J-13" garages. The 20' x 49' two stall garage has a 6' x 25' gable side bay centered on the rear elevation. The truck garage at Valley Center Forest Fire Station is in better physical condition than the Colfax building but it has been remodeled. The subject garage is virtually unaltered. It served originally as a fire truck garage being reassigned as a residence garage and warehouse after the construction of the associated apparatus building circa 1951. The ranger's residence has been removed. This is one of the few relatively unaltered CCC era truck garages to be found in the CDF building collection. The building is a significant historic resource.

**Comments:**

The tower was originally located on Jakeys Hill in the Eldorado National Forest. It was erected by the CCC in 1935 and relocated by CDF to the present site in 1965. The original cab was replaced without consideration to the original USFS-CCC "C-3" cab design. This is the only USFS-CCC "L-4" tower at an airport in the CDF building collection. There are, however, two "L-4" towers in the CDF fire lookout collection.

**Comments:**

The property records for this site designate this as a "D type" barracks. The reference probably confirms that the building was based on a variation of one of the USFS-CCC "D" working plans. The CDF property collection includes seven combination barracks that appear to have originated as 25' x 40' buildings. The Dobbins building was remodeled into a "captain's residence" circa 1966 (reference CDF Plan AA-258). An associated ranger's residence has been removed. The original station truck garage remains. The compound as a whole is considered an important cultural resource.

**Comments:**

The CDF building collection includes only one 26' x 30' three stall truck garage that dates from the CCC era. This building is probably a variation of one of the USFS-CCC "J" type two truck garages. The "J" designs are believed to have included both one and two bay residence garages, and one and two bay truck garages (with or without storerooms). The Dobbins building was remodeled circa 1965. The station is considered an important cultural resource.

There are six stations in the CDF property inventory that have what the S-5 Forms designated as a "military surplus building." Seven buildings exist, all of which are 20 feet wide and vary from 48 feet to 88 feet in length. Three of them served as combination barracks, two others included a truck garage at one end. Comments:

There are three buildings in the CDF collection that appear to be based on a standardized 20' x 50' floor plan. The design is probably based on a variation of one of the USFS-CCC "D" series working plans. All three surviving buildings have been remodeled and enlarged since their original construction. The subject building was remodeled and enlarged with a bathroom wing addition circa 1958 (reference CDF Plan AA-153). The building was remodeled again circa 1967 when a separate combination kitchen and messhall was erected at the site. Another addition was constructed on the west gable end circa 1990.

**Comments:**

There are seven buildings in the CDF collection that appear to be based on a standardized 25' x 40' floor plan. These buildings were probably based on a variation of the USFS-CCC "D" plans. They've all undergone varying degrees of alterations. The subject building was remodeled circa 1965. It was converted to a ranger's residence at that time as a new combination barracks had been constructed. The newer building is located to the south (and upslope) from the former barracks which fronts on State Highway 120. The former barracks is considered an important cultural resource.

**Comments:**

This and the building at the Badger Forest Fire Station are the only 26' x 32' combination storeroom and two truck garage in the CDF collection that date from the CCC era. A slightly larger building of similar design is located at the Smith Creek Forest Fire Station. The Groveland truck garage was originally used for sheltering the station fire trucks. Since 1966 it has been used as a combination residence garage and residence storeroom. A replacement apparatus building is located by the replacement combination barracks. Overall, the building is not a bad example of a CCC era fire truck garage.

**Comments:**

This is the only USFS-CCC "D-10" in the CDF collection that has been used solely as a combination kitchen and messhall. The other "D-10" types serve as combination barracks. The Mount Danaher building was first remodeled in 1946. It has undergone additional revisions since then but it still basically retains its original foot print and roof pattern. Mount Danaher is the only administrative site in the CDF property inventory to serve as a combination ranger unit headquarters, forest fire station, and fire lookout station. Facilities for all three activities are still maintained at the site.

Comments:

C. Raymond Clar's book, *California Government and Forestry: during the Young and Rolph administrations*, reports that the State first surveyed a lookout site upon Mount Zion in 1926. CDF acquired title to the property in 1932 by which time a SERA work relief camp had been located here. The site was converted to a CCC camp with the advent of the Federal employment relief programs. Clar's book also reports that a "group of civic minded women of Amador County had organized a Mt. Zion Improvement Club... for the purpose of improving the public recreation facilities at the site." Monies were raised so that the State could purchase additional land. The land was designated the Mount Zion State Forest in July of 1932 (pgs 77-80). The subject house was constructed by the CCCs. A photograph in Clar's book (page 270) shows the ranger's residence at Mount Danaher with the caption "Plan was standard design by qualified architects." The Mount Zion and Mount Danaher houses appear to be identical. They're probably based on a variation of one of the USFS-CCC "A" plans. The State sold the Mount Danaher residence site. The Mount Zion house has undergone a few cosmetic changes over the years but still retains a high degree of historic architectural integrity.

Comments:

There are two 32' x 85' foot warehouses in the CDF building collection that date from the CCC era.
