PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project site is located at the Wilbur Springs Forest Fire Station at the intersection of Highway 16 and Highway 20 in western Colusa County, approximately 18 miles west of Williams. The project consists of repairing and replacing the leach field portion of the septic system at the station. The leach field is located just north of the barracks. The area has been disturbed over the years as it was used for employee parking for several years. Part of the driveway access to the generator building is also in the general vicinity of the project sites. Most of the project activities would occur within previously disturbed areas. The area has been used and maintained continuously for several years by the department. Once the new leach field system is in place, the area will be leveled, and the driveway serving the generator will be re-aligned to prevent vehicle traffic over the system.
